This working seminar is **restricted** to those officers who are currently certified as firearms instructors by the Wyoming Law Enforcement Academy.

The focus of this training is to

- ✓ Verify the instructor's existing skills and proficiency for re-certification purposes.
- ✓ Enhance and add to the instructor's knowledge and skills.

NOTE: This course is not an "attendance only" course. It will be physically and mentally demanding. Participants should prepare for proficiency **PRIOR** to arrival.

PREREQUISITES: One the **first day** of the course, each applicant must shoot passing scores (as specified below):

- ✓ W.L.E.A. Pistol Proficiency Course – **90%**
- ✓ W.L.E.A. Shotgun Slug Phase – **90% ***
- ✓ W.L.E.A. Shotgun Buckshot Phase – **90% ***

The student who fails to meet these requirements will be allowed to attend the training, but will not be re-certified unless and until he/she returns to the WLEA and shoots the required passing scores.

**Optional – student/agencies discretion.*

NOTE: Successful completion of this course

- ✓ Is required at least once during the current certification period.
- ✓ Meets one of the requirements necessary to qualify for W.L.E.A. Firearms Instructor re-certification.
- ✓ Will result in the student being P.O.S.T. certified as a firearms instructor.

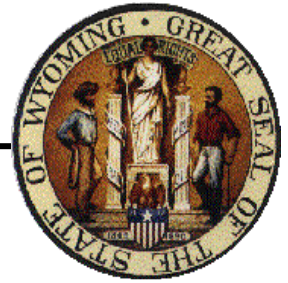

EQUIPMENT LIST

- Duty handgun with 3 magazines or speed loaders
- Patrol Rifle with sling (**Mandatory**)
- Ballistic vest
- Ball cap with brim that protects eyes
- Wrap around polycarbonate eye protection
- Ear protection
- Knee and elbow pads recommended
- Sun Screen
- 100 rounds of Handgun **LEAD FREE Frangible** ammunition
- 600 rounds Patrol Rifle **LEAD FREE Frangible** ammunition
- Clothing suitable for range wear
- Collard shirt(s) for classroom sessions
- Shotgun **with sling** (rifle sights suggested) – (**Optional**) with sufficient numbers of rounds to complete proficiency testing. Rounds available from WLEA @\$\$.60 each
- 30 rifled **LEAD FREE Frangible** slugs – (**Optional**)
30 rounds of **LEAD FREE Frangible** 00 Buck – (**Optional**)

Written documentation on Agency Letterhead of at least 40 training hours within the past 2 years. Your Agencies computer generated, or any typed form is acceptable.

As a part of the application process, each firearms instructor shall be required to shoot a minimum of **90%** on WLEA Pistol Proficiency Course, **90%** on WLEA Patrol Rifle Proficiency Course at completion of this Patrol Rifle Certification Course and (**90%** on WLEA Slug and 00 Buck Shotgun Proficiency Courses – **Optional**). The pistol course and rifle courses will require one passing score if achieved on first attempt. If that score is not met on the first attempt, then that phase will require two consecutive passing scores. **Proficiency will only be offered on the first day of the course and only three attempts will be allowed for Handgun and Shotgun.** If you have any questions regarding the equipment or requirements, contact Richard Crays at 307-358-4563 x234 or richard.crays@wyo.gov.

Changes for the 2012 Firearms Instructor Re-Certification: In consideration of the curriculum changes that have taken place last year at WLEA regarding the addition of the patrol rifle and the move to make shotgun training a Special School, the re-certification will be geared toward certifying all current Firearms Instructors as Patrol Rifle Instructors. Instructors who wish to continue to have the Academy certify them as Shotgun Instructors will still need to complete that Proficiency Course the first morning of class, but that is optional and based on your agency's preference. The Proficiency testing of the Patrol Rifle will take place the last 2 hours on the last day of class, not at the beginning with the handgun and optionally, the shotgun.
