
Gov. Gordon and WASCOP Announce \$2.4 Million Grant to Benefit Law Enforcement and Communities

We're excited to announce that the Wyoming Association of Sheriffs and Chiefs of Police (WASCOP) has been awarded a grant to support law enforcement when they respond to people experiencing a mental health crisis.

The Leona M. and Harry B. Helmsley Charitable Trust is generously providing \$2.4 million over 3 years to pilot Virtual Crisis Care. "Connecting law enforcement officers and behavioral health professionals is instrumental in providing top-notch care on scene, while reducing unnecessary trips to emergency rooms, mental health hospitals, and jails," said Walter Panzirer, a Helmsley Trustee. "We're excited to help bring this innovative program to Wyoming and improve rural and frontier residents' access to vital mental health resources."

Virtual Crisis Care provides law enforcement with 24/7 access to behavioral health professionals who can assist with de-escalation, stabilization, and safety assessment through the use of telehealth. Following the encounter, a referral for follow-up care is sent directly to a local Community Mental Health Center.
